The 5 Collider Family Values that impact our Lives, Homes, Families, Communities and Church to **COLLIDE with GOD!**

1. Imagine the End: Deut. 6:4 "The Lord our God, the Lord is one."

STAY FOCUSED ON THE BIG PICTURE

It is as if Moses was saying: As you lead, do it from a perspective that **everything is connected to God**. It's all about Him, it's not really about the nations, or the church, not even about the family, and it's really about God. If we don't start with God, we may end up in the wrong place. It's about focus. Practically speaking, when families intentionally and consistently embrace the value that God is God, "means they strive to parent from a **single-minded perspective**. The more they remember this is really all about God, the easier it is for them to **focus their priorities on what matters most**. So it is critical fo central.

2. Fight for the heart! "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength."

LOVE GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART

Moses, after 40 years in the wilderness and with all the commandments, said something that is recorded for the first time in Scripture, something Jesus Himself would repeat and amplify fifteen hundred years later, "Love the Lord..."

Moses is fighting for something that is more important than lifestyle or practice. He is fighting for the heart. Moses is warning about the danger of a generation losing their faith. If you want to pass on a legacy to the next generation, it has to be transferred relationally.

Anytime you pass down, rules, practices, or truths outside the context of a genuine, compelling love, you establish an empty religion. Moses was drawing a circle around the entire faith of his people and it centers on loving God.

This is so relevant for parents. Most parents buy into the myth that what is most important is to pass down the reasons for the rules. If they simply explain why they have the rule, it will result in a different response and behavior from their children, right? It makes sense if it's logical, then they will behave. Wrong, the problem with reasons is that you can debate them: but you can't debate a trusted relationship. Unfortunately some of us parents are better skilled at fighting to win the argument than we are at fighting to win the heart. The most important way to you fight for the heart is to build a relationship that is trustworthy.

3. Make it personal: "these commandments that I give you today are to be upon your heart"

3 4. Create a rhythm: "Impress them on your children, talk about them when you sit at home, walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up".

Meal time – formal discussion – teacher – establish value



Drive time – informal dialogue – friend – interpret life



Bed time – intimate conversation – counselor – build intimacy



Morning time – encouraging words – coach – instill purpose

5. Widen the circle: "Hear O Israel!"

KIDS NEED ADDITIONAL INFLUENCES TO GUIDE THEM

Moses was speaking to the whole of Israel about the importance of families pass on their faith to the next generation. In other words, he was talking to every parent and every leader. As important as the monologue was with parents, it was not only for them: Moses was speaking to all of Israel. It is clear in his language that he was challenging the entire nation with this principle. These values were intended to be practiced at every level of Hebrew society!

When Moses was delivering the message, he was was making this a national issue, a tribal issue, and a family issue. Parents of teenagers often realize that their children are hungry for approval and advice from someone who is not their parent. So there are only a couple of options: Kids will either seek out another adult's validation on their own, or the parent can be a part of the process and pursue strategic relationships for them. In a culture where community is not automatic and role models are limited, parents should become intentional about finding spiritual leaders and mentors for their kids. Every son and daughter needs other adult voices in their lives who will say things a Christian parent would say. One of the smartest things a church leader can do for a family is to provide a system where kids and teenagers can be connected to that kind of adult influence. One of the smartest things parents can do again is to participate in a ministry where they can find the right kind of adult influences for their kids.
